
#### Cameroon Catalyst

Members of Cameroon Catalyst, the volunteer organisation run by Civil Engineering students at the University of Southampton, have been to Cameroon to complete their next challenge...



#### Workshop

This year's Cameroon Catalyst's project included the creation of a 180 m<sup>2</sup> workshop to improve important mechanical, building and carpentry skills in the village. The workshop includes a teaching area, workshops and a communal area. The total cost of the workshop is estimated at £30,000. Mosame Trust will set up micro business to run the workshop and then profits made from these businesses will help fund the work of the January Hope Centre.







The team were involved in designing & fundraising for the building of a workshop building where young people from Bambouti and surrounding villages could learn a trade such as (car mechanic, carpentry & general building skills). With a view to encourage self sufficiency and promote a sustainable development from the bottom up, the workshops will play a major part in the Micro business scheme Mosame Trust is launching to encourage entrepreneurship and various small business initiatives to spring up and enable villagers to stand on their own two feet in a foreseeable future. The profit generated from these businesses will help to fund local community projects.

Whilst in Bambouti the Cameroon Catalyst Team interviewed the villagers to understand their needs and investigate the impact and the opportunities these facilities brings to the community. This information will be used to plan future projects and ensure the villager's needs are fulfilled.
